#### THE COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

Smt. Kesharbai Lahoti Mahavidyalaya, run by Shri. Ganeshdas Rathi Chhatralay Samiti, was established on 20<sup>th</sup> June 1960. **Recently, the Society has been recognized as Marwadi Linguistic Minority Educational Society by the Government of Maharashtra**. The college started with just one course of B.A. and in 1962 B.Com. was added. Since then it has been a victorious march adding M.A. (Hindi) in 1970 and M.Com. in 1972, Diploma in Taxation (D.Tax.) in 1981, Diploma in Business Management (D.B.M.) in 2003, M.A.History in 2005, M.A.Geography, Master of Computer Management (M.C.M.), Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) in 2006 and Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A.) in 2008. The U.G.C. Sponsored Career Oriented Courses viz. - a) Event Management b) E-Commerce c) Accounting & Auditing d) Fashion Designing. M.A. Political Science & Gandhian Study Centre in 2011 were subsequently added. The junior wing came into existence in 1976 and addition came of IT in 2007 and Maths in 2009. Another stream was added in the junior wing with the commencement of M.C.V.C. in 1992.

The Management, the Principal and the Staff are proud to state that the college has a unique existence in Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University and the city of Amravati as the only college offering instruction in three media viz. English, Hindi and Marathi in Commerce faculty and running professional courses like Diploma in Taxation (D.Tax.), Diploma in Business Management (D.B.M.), Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A.) and Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.). In addition to this, the college has earned great reputation for its contribution in the field of games & sports.

### (GENERAL INFORMATION & INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS)

### □ E.B.C. CONCESSION □

- a) E.B.C. form should be submitted to the college as per guidelines displayed on the college notice board with income-certificate of the year 2022-23 and two attested copies of ration card.
- b) Students hailing from villages with population below 10,000 will have to submit income certificate duly signed by village Sarpanch. Income Certificate issued by Deputy-Sarpanch will not be accepted. Those who are from a locality with population above 10,000 will have to submit Income Certificate duly signed by a Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tahsildar.
- c) A student below the age of 18 years will have to submit concession forms duly signed by his / her parent or legitimate guardian to claim E.B.C. concession.
- d) To be eligible for E.B.C. concession a student must have 75% of attendance in each subject every month and show satisfactory progress in Unit Tests and Terminal Exams. Those who do not fulfil these conditions shall not be deemed eligible for E.B.C. concession.
- e) The students claiming E.B.C. concession must attach the original copy of the Court Affidavit signed by a Magistrate for the gap period, if any, to the E.B.C. Form.
- f) After submitting E.B.C. concession forms or scholarship forms students are advised to obtain acknowledgement of the same.

### **D** RULES REGARDING ATTENDANCE **D**

- 1) Students must attend atleast 75% of the lectures (including practicals) in each class in order to De eligible for Board / University exams.
- 2) Students who fall short of the requisite attendance without substantial reason will be fined as per the rules and be barred from taking University / Board examination.
- 3) The names of students who remain absent for a long period will be removed from the college Attendance record.

### □ DISCIPLINE & CODE OF CONDUCT □

- 1) It is obligatory on the part of the students to possess prescribed text books and other relevant study materials.
- Systematic, satisfactory & timely completion of home assignments is mandatory. Any failure on this front will be deemed as an act of indiscipline and may invite fine. The college will seriously consider this fact while determining eligibility of students for University / Board exams.
- 3) Students must not cause damage to or destroy college property. Any misuse or damage caused intentionally or unintentionally will invite stringent punishment. All the students from the class involved in the misact will be held responsible collectively for any damage in the particular class, unless the individual offender is identified.

- 4) Students shall maintain decorum in the college premises. Any indiscipline or misbehaviour, both inside and outside the college premises will attract severe punishment. The names of students found guilty of misconduct will be removed from the college rolls.

- 7) Duplicate copies of Identity Card, Transfer Certificate (T.C.) and Admission Receipt will be provided on request of the student by paying fees of Rs.50/- each.
- 8) The students are directed to record permanent address/ contact numbers of their parents / guardians. Any change in this respect must be brought to the notice of college office immediately.
- 9) It is the responsibility of the students / parents / guardians to find out to which scholarships (enlisted on page no.58) the student is eligible for and to apply accordingly for the same along with the required documents.
- 10) Any difficulty faced by the student should be brought to the notice of the Principal or the Registrar.
- 11) Smoking, chewing of gutka, pan, tobacco or taking any banned drugs and narcotics, etc. on the college campus are strictly prohibited.
- 12) No student will send anything concerning the college for publication without prior permission of the Principal.
- 13) Any political movement, demonstration or agitation involving the name of the college is strictly prohibited.
- 14) Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any student found guilty will be proceeded against under Maharashtra Government Ordinance No. 33 dated 15 May, 1999 and will be expelled from the college forthwith.
- 15) Students shall see the college notice board daily. The college will not be held responsible for any loss arising out of any negligence in this regard.
- 16) No outside artists will be allowed to take part in the college cultural activities.

#### (Refund of Tuition Fees and Laboratory fees on cancellation of admission)

As per UGC Notification of Oct., 2018, para 4.1.3 If a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of study in which he/ she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following five tier system for the refund of fees remitted by the student.

**Note :** The laboratory fee shall be charged to the students, wherever practical work is prescribed in the syllabus and shall have to be utilized exclusively for conducting practical, purchase of equipment glassware, chemicals etc.

2) The fees and charged will be increased after every two year by 10% (considering 2020-21) as base year 3) The facilities fee for U.G. and P.G. shall have to utilized for providing Hi-tech facilities such as advance teaching aids like L.C.D. Projector, Video Conferencing, Internet, wifi etc. to make teaching and learning process more effective.

4) The University share from the fees prescribed for Environmental Studies shall be Rs. 75/- out of Rs. 150. This fee shall be charged to part II student at under graduate level.

5) Whereever the govt. prescribed the fee for a particular item/hear, it shall prevail over the fee prescribed by University and the College /Institute will charge only the fees prescribed by the State Govt. or any other competent authority of Govt.

6) The fees collected under each head shall be spent on that head. However in case the College/ Institution could not spend. The entire amount under that head by the end of February, may re-appropriate. In any case

not more than 20% re-appropriation from that Head may be permitted with a proper permission of a committee comprising of Principal as Chairman, the Finance / Accounts Officer and one senior most Teacher. Whenever under whichever Head the College / Institution receiving a grant the re-appropriation rules shall be followed.

### □ COLLEGE EXAMINATIONS □

- All students will compulsorily have to appear for the following examinations.
   a) Four Class-Room Unit Tests.b) One Terminal Exam.
- 2) Those remaining absent from the above exams without sufficient cause will be fined as per the rules framed by the College Examination Committee and may not be allowed to appear at the Final University / Board Examination.
- 3) Junior College Examinations shall be held as per the set rules.

### □ IDENTITY CARD □

- 1) All the students shall be issued Identity Cards. No students without Identity Card will be allowed to enter the campus.
- 2) The students must keep wearing the Identity Cards so long as they are on the college campus.
- 3) No student will be allowed to attend or participate in any activity inside or outside the college campus without Identity Card.
- 4) If the Identity Card is lost, a fresh one will be issued on payment of ₹ 50=00.

### □ PHYSICAL EFFICIENCY TEST AND MEDICAL EXAMINATION □

- It is compulsory for all the students except the N.C.C. Cadets, N.S.S. Volunteers and for those who participate in the inter-collegiate tournaments to attend physical training classes. In case a student fails to secure 80% of attendance in these classes, he shall be fined as per the rules.
- As per the University Ordinance No. 3, it is compulsory for all the students to appear in the physical efficiency test which is usually held in the month of January or February. Any failure on students' part shall invite disciplinary action.
- 3) All the students of the college are required to remain present for a medical examination. Those failing to turn up for the test on the scheduled day will have to get themselves examined by paying a specified fine or else they may face disciplinary action.
